PARSHA MATTERS by RABBI SAM TAYLOR

In the first night of Rosh Hashana, before the meal truly begins, something quietly beautiful takes place. We pass around apple slices dipped in honey, bless a pomegranate, and eat leeks, dates, squash, and other symbolic foods that rarely share the same table. At first glance, it can seem like a charming tradition, almost playful. Yet the sages understood these foods as far more than custom. The Talmud records Abaye's teaching that since a siman, a sign, carries significance, a person should make a practice of eating symbolic foods at the beginning of the year. Each one reflects a heartfelt prayer through the sound of its Hebrew or Aramaic name: karti, leek, recalls yikarti, "may that which afflicts us be cut off"; rubia evokes yirbu, "may our merits increase"; tamrei, dates, suggests yitamu, "may our struggles come to an end."

Why should eating a vegetable or a piece of fruit matter before God? Our Sages explain that the power of the simanim is not magical but spiritual and psychological. As the Gemara teaches, "siman milta hi", a sign is a meaningful thing because it shapes the heart and mind of the person who embraces it. By speaking our hopes aloud while holding these foods, we transform abstract wishes into tangible acts of faith. The prayer is no longer only spoken but it is seen, touched, tasted, and shared. In this way, the simanim help us begin the new year with intention, directing our thoughts toward blessing, growth, and possibility.

That is the enduring gift of the simanim. Rosh Hashana invites us to envision, in vivid detail, the people we hope to become and the year we pray to experience. Before a single day of the new year has unfolded, we give voice to our aspirations and symbolically taste them together. We do not wait for the year to prove itself before we hope for it but we begin by blessing it into being. So when the apple, the pomegranate, or the dates come your way this year, don't simply eat them. Pause to say the words, and let each small bite carry a genuine hope for the year ahead. Sometimes the greatest blessings begin with the simplest signs.

Rabbi Yuval Cherlow is a graduate of Yeshivat Har Etzion and a retired IDF Major. He co-founded Yeshivat Orot Shaul, named in honour of Shaul Koschitzky, and serves as head of the Tzohar Rabbinical Organization's Ethics Center. 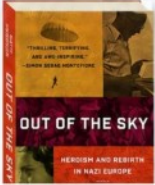
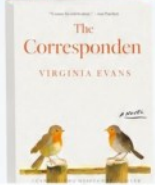
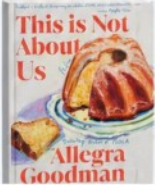
